1. Call to Order by the Chair

Mayor Rydell called the meeting to order at 11:23 a.m.

Consider Approving the Minutes for the February 9, 2022 CAECD Board of Managers Meeting

3. Consider Accepting the Financial Report for the Period October 1, 2021 to February 28, 2022
Silvia Alvarado, Director of Finance

Ms. Alvarado presented the board a financial report for the period of Oct. 1, 2021, to Feb. 28, 2022. She said the report showed a \$28,964,615 fund balance which includes operation and obligation costs yet to be spent as well as the district's reserves and set aside for emergency operations and equipment replacement. Ms. Alvarado noted at the end of the period the revenues were \$5,253,686.77 and expenditures were \$5,300,386.18.

A motion was made by Judge Oakley to accept the financial report for the period of Oct. 1, 2021, to Feb. 28, 2022. Judge Haden seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

 Consider Adopting a Resolution Providing Signature Authority to Individuals for the Capital Area Emergency Communications District
