CAPCOG General Assembly | Summary Minutes

1. **Call to Order and Opening Remarks**

Mayor Lew White, Chair

Mayor White welcomed the CAPCOG General Assembly representatives and guests to the meeting. He led a moment of silence for the events that took place on September 11, 2001 and the first responders who responded to the incidents.

2. **Approve the December 13, 2023, Meeting Minutes**

Mayor White, Chair

Mayor White asked if everyone had a chance to review the minutes. Williamson County Commissioner Cynthia Long made a motion to approve the Dec. 13, 2023 meeting minutes. San Marcos Mayor Jane Hughson seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

3. **Introduction of CAPCOG's New Executive Director**

Mayor White, Chair

Mayor White said, the Executive Committee was tasked with hiring a new executive director for the agency when Ms. Betty Voights decided to retire after 25 years of service. He introduced Mr. Chris Miller to the General Assembly. Mr. Miller will be taking over as head of the agency.

Mr. Miller said he appreciates the opportunity and is excited to lead the great organization that Ms. Voights has built. He said he has council of governments and local government experience. He looks forward to working with everyone throughout the region.

4. **Election of Nominating Committee for 2024-2025 Term**

Chris Miller, Executive Director

Mayor White said the recommendation for the Nominating Committee includes former Smithville Council Member Janice Bruno, Llano County Judge Ron Cunningham, Burnet County Commissioner Joe Don Dockery, Williamson County Commissioner Cynthia Long, Leander Mayor Christine De L'isle, Hays County Commissioner Lon Shell, and that he would be chairing the committee.

Mayor Hughson made a motion to approve the Nominating Committee members. Commissioner Long seconded. It passed unanimously.

5. **Adoption of Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Budget**

Andrew Hoekzema, Deputy Executive Director

Mr. Hoekzema provided a summary of the proposed 2025 fiscal year budget. He said it was proposed at just above \$40 million in expenditures with an amount just below \$400,000 in unrestricted funds, monies not constrained by grants or contacts. He mentioned the budget accounted for 77 positions and has a fridge rate of 56.95 percent and the indirect rate estimated at 25.40 percent.

Mr. Hoekzema noted, the largest revenues in the budget are from 9-1-1 service fees, \$16.2 million; and federal funds that are allocated through the state consisting mostly of funding for the Area Agency on Aging of the Capital Area, \$15.9 million. He said other revenue categories in the budget consisted of

local & non-grant at \$2.48 million, state funding at \$4.83 million, federal direct funding at \$272,235, and other grants at \$566,807. Mr. Hoekzema said expenditures by division included:

- Aging Service - \$16.42 million
- Emergency Communications - \$19.37 million
- Homeland Security - \$1.36 million
- Regional Law Enforcement Academy - \$722,619
- Regional Planning & Services - \$2.25 million
- Other and Contingency - \$138,571

Mr. Hoekzema then discussed budget highlights from each division in the proposed budget.

Burnet County Commissioner Joe Don Dockery made a motion to adopt the proposed Fiscal Year 2025 Budget. Commissioner Long seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

6. Recognition of former Executive Director Betty Voights

Mayor Lew White

Mayor White introduced four speakers that discussed Ms. Voights' tenure at the CAPCOG — Former Burnet County Judge Donna Klaeger, former Hays County Hays Commissioner Will Conley, Commissioner Long and Austin Mayor Kirk Watson. The General Land Office also presented Ms. Voights with a recognition for her outstanding service to Texas through her work in the region.

Ms. Klaeger couldn't be in attendance but asked former Smithville Council Member and Executive Committee Member Janice Bruno to read a statement. Ms. Klaeger's statement congratulated Ms. Voights on her retirement and dedicating 28 years to regional planning. She said, everyone has learned from Ms. Voights and should be grateful for her time, leadership and patience. Ms. Klaeger also stated that through her leadership Ms. Voights has brought many great programs to Central Texas.

Former Commissioner Conley said, Ms. Voights has helped inform and educate a great number of elected officials about the benefits of regionalism. He spoke about how Ms. Voights had started programs that have become the standard for operating around the state and nation.

Mayor Watson said Ms. Voights was always there to allow entities to collaborate and has a heart built for a public servant. He said during her tenure she became a resource for information about COGs and government. Mayor Watson said her leadership led to the formation of the Capital Area Emergency Communications District and to the state funding communities who are near nonattainment of the national ozone air quality standards. Mayor Watson said that CAPCOG has been on the cutting edge of planning because of Ms. Voights' determination to do things the right way. Mayor Watson also presented Ms. Voights with a proclamation from the city of Austin that proclaimed Sept. 11, 2024, as Betty Voights Day in Austin.

Commissioner Long said she could speak a long time about the milestones Ms. Voights has achieved and only a few have been mentioned today. She noted that Ms. Voights has affected many elected officials who have worked with her over the years. Commissioner Long said Ms. Voights left an indelible mark on CAPCOG and has served with distinction.

Ms. Voights said her job was easy because of the people she worked with. She explained how the COG became an emergency communications district through working with a variety of elected officials. Ms. Voights said the one thing that is the easiest is making sure you have all the city and county officials

come to the table to figure how to solve issues, regardless of if they are urban or rural, or republican or democrat.

7. Other Business

Mayor White didn't call for any additional business.

8. Adjourn

Mayor White adjourned the meeting at 1 p.m.

CAPCOG Bylaws Excerpt Section 4.4. and Article V

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Section 4.4 – Nominating Committee

(a) At its summer or fall meeting each year the General Assembly shall appoint a seven-person Nominating Committee to nominate Executive Committee members and officers of the Council to serve during the following year. The Nominating Committee members serve for a year or until a new Nominating Committee, which may include members of the former Committee, is appointed.

(b) A Nominating Committee member must be a General Assembly representative of a full member, an associate member, or a citizen representative. Two Nominating Committee members must be Executive Committee members and at least two members must be General Assembly members not currently serving on the Executive Committee. The chair of the Council shall serve as the Nominating Committee chair, or the vice chair in the absence of the chair.

(c) The Nominating Committee shall nominate at least one qualified representative for each position on the Executive Committee. The Nominating Committee shall also nominate one Executive Committee member for each office of the Council. In making nominations to the Executive Committee, the Nominating Committee shall consider the economic, urban-rural, geographic, ethnic, and gender diversity of the Region and, insofar as possible, shall make its nominations to reflect this diversity. In the case of November elections, a person who has been elected but not sworn into office may be considered by the Nominating Committee contingent upon the candidate being designated as the General Assembly representative of that local government at the time of the General Assembly election.

(d) The Nominating Committee shall solicit interest for service on the Executive Committee from all eligible General Assembly members. To be eligible for service, General Assembly members must be elected officials from cities and counties who are full members and who are officially designated by that city or county as the General Assembly representative. The Nominating Committee shall submit its nominations in writing for Executive Committee members to the Executive Director of the Council and the Executive Director shall furnish copies of the Nominating Committee report to each General Assembly representative during October of each year. A qualified representative who is not included on the slate of the Nominating Committee but wishes to be considered for election to the Executive Committee by the General Assembly may notify the Executive Director in writing no later than November 30th and specify which nominated representative he or she wishes to challenge. Nominations will not be accepted from the floor. A contested slot will be voted on separately from the Nominating Committee slate.

(e) The Nominating Committee shall submit its nominations in writing for the officers of the Council to the Executive Committee with the notice of the January Executive Committee meeting.

(f) In accordance with Local Government Code, Section 391.006(c), the Nominating Committee shall solicit interest for service on the Executive Committee from State Legislators whose districts are wholly or partly within the State Planning Region 12.

(g) Legislators eligible for membership on the Executive Committee may apply for membership on the Executive Committee by submitting a written request to the Nominating Committee. At least one eligible Legislator may serve in an ex-officio position on the Executive

Committee. The Nominating Committee shall recommend at least one State Legislator for an ex-officio position on the Executive Committee when it submits nominations to the Executive Director during October of each year.

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ARTICLE V – THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 5.1 – Governing Body

The Executive Committee is the governing body of the Council between meetings of the General Assembly. Members of the Executive Committee shall also serve on the Board of Managers of the Capital Area Emergency Communications District (CAECD) as an additional duty.

Section 5.2 – Composition

(a) The composition of the Executive Committee is as follows:

- (1) two representatives from Travis County;
- (2) one representative from each of the other nine counties in State Planning Region 12;
- (3) one representative from the City of Austin;
- (4) one representative from a city with a population in excess of one hundred thousand (100,000);
- (5) four representatives from cities with populations between 25,000 and 100,000;
- (6) five representatives from cities with populations under 25,000; and
- (7) three at-large members.
- (8) at least one State of Texas Legislator in accordance with Local Government Code, Section 391.006(c).

(b) At each Annual Meeting, the General Assembly shall elect members from the categories described in Subsections (a) (1) through (7) of this section 5.2.

(c) In selecting the medium-sized city, small city and at-large representatives, the General Assembly shall consider population and geography to ensure diversity among the members of the Executive Committee.

(d) All of the Executive Committee members, except for the ex-officio State Legislator, must be elected officials of the governing bodies of the full members of the Council.

(e) An elected official of the governing body of a full member of the Council may complete his or her term on the Executive Committee if he or she was an elected official at the time of election to the Executive Committee and he or she continues as a representative on the General Assembly.

(f) A State Legislator selected for the Executive Committee shall serve as an ex-officio member, will not be eligible to vote, to serve as an officer of the Council, or to serve on subcommittees, and will not count toward a quorum.

Section 5.3 – Meetings

(a) The Executive Committee shall meet regularly each month at a time and place specified by resolution.

(b) The Executive Committee shall meet specially on call of the chairperson of the Council or upon the written request of at least one-third of the members of the Executive Committee.

Section 5.4 – Notice

Notice of regular and special meetings of the Executive Committee must comply with the Open Meetings Act.

Section 5.5 – Quorum and Action

(a) A quorum of the Executive Committee consists of a majority of the total number of members, excluding vacancies, but a quorum may not consist of fewer than thirteen members.

(b) If a quorum is present when a vote is taken, the affirmative vote of a majority of the members present is the act of the Executive Committee.

Section 5.6 – Term

Executive Committee members serve one-year terms, beginning on the date they are elected and expiring on December 31. An Executive Committee member may complete his or her term if or until his or her successor is elected and the member continues to meet the requirements as set out in Section 5.2.

Section 5.7 – Vacancy

(a) A vacancy on the Executive Committee occurs:

- (1) when a member dies;
- (2) when a member resigns;
- (3) when a member is removed;
- (4) when a member becomes disqualified to serve; or
- (5) when a member incurs four absences as described in subsection (b).

(b) If an Executive Committee member misses three Executive Committee meetings in a calendar year, the Executive Director shall notify the Executive Committee member in writing of the absences and that a fourth absence will vacate the member's position on the Executive Committee. If the Executive Committee member misses a fourth Executive Committee meeting, having received the Executive Director's notice, the Executive Committee shall declare the absent member's position on the Executive Committee vacant unless the member persuades the Executive Committee, at its next meeting, that there was good cause for the absence.

(c) Executive Committee members shall also serve on the Board of Managers of the CAECD; a

missed meeting of the CAECD shall be counted toward the absences described in (b).

(d) If a vacancy occurs on the Executive Committee, the Nominating Committee may nominate at the request of the Executive Committee, and the Executive Committee shall elect a replacement to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term if the vacancy occurs and the nomination process is completed no later than June 15 of that year.

Section 5.8 – Powers and Responsibilities

(a) The Executive Committee has the following general powers:

- (1) to sue and be sued in the name of the Council;
- (2) to contract;
- (3) to acquire, own, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property, tangible or intangible, or any interest in it;
- (4) to invest the Council's assets in real or personal property, tangible or intangible, or any interest in it;
- (5) to sell, assign, mortgage, or pledge all or any part of the Council's real or personal property, or any interest in it;
- (6) to borrow or lend money or other property;
- (7) to apply for, receive, and use contributions and grants.

(b) The Executive Committee has the following general responsibilities:

- (1) to have prepared, review, and submit an annual budget for the Council to the General Assembly;
- (2) to designate one or more depositories for the Council's funds and specify the individuals authorized to sign and countersign checks and other instruments for withdrawal of the funds;
- (3) to receive, review, and, if necessary, act upon reports and recommendations of its subcommittees and of committees of the Council, and to notify the General Assembly of any action taken;
- (4) to make recommendations, formulate policy, and take action on matters referred to it by the General Assembly that best carry out the purposes of the Council.

Section 5.9 – Creation of Subcommittees

(a) The Executive Committee by resolution may create one or more subcommittees and appoint members of the Executive Committee to serve on them. Each subcommittee may have three or more members who serve at the pleasure of the Executive Committee.

(b) To the extent specified in the creating resolution, a subcommittee may exercise the Executive Committee's powers and carry out its responsibilities described in Section 5.8.

(c) The Executive Committee in the creating resolution shall appoint officers of the subcommittee from among its members and shall describe the meeting, quorum, and voting requirements for the subcommittee.
